



Henderson- A record 81 new industrial plants and 136 expansions-representing investments of \$194.8 million-were announced during 1964 in the two state region served by Carolina Power & Light Com-

The 1964 figures top last year's \$103 million and 1962's \$110 million.

Dan E. Stewart, CP&L, vicepresident for area development, describes the growth record as "an all-time high which demonstrates the close operation and hard work put forth by State and local industrial development agencies other utilities and individuals."

Stewart said the industrial INTERVIEWER WANTED FOR growth will create directly about 16,000 new jobs and add \$56 million a year in payrolls directly to the economy.

The 1964 expansion brought to the CP&L area seven more of the nation's 500 largest industrial firms, making a total of 54 companies among Magazine's "Big 500" which now have 108 plants in the CP&L region.
