More than 17,000 drycleaners attended the convention at which an exhibit covering 80,000 square feet showed off the latest equipment in the textile care field.

During three days of special business meetings conventioners were advised on world affairs and labor and manpower problems by such authorities as former congressman Dr. Walter Judd, Harvard Professor James J. Healy and Federal Wage-Hour Administrator Clarence Lundquist. New fashions, fabric behavior, and technical developments were also discussed at the meetings by the cleaning industry's leading experts.

Clothing Tips

Q. Is it necessary to use a lining in skirts when using bonded fabrics?

A. The purpose of bonding the fabric was to eliminate lining. Most literature says

that it is not necessary to line this fabric. The process of bonding has not been perfected, however, and seamstresses are finding that in straight skirts the seat is stretching after only a short wearing time. To prevent this and to achieve a more professional looking outfit, lining with a firm material is recommended. Another time when you may want to line material is when using light colored materials that you can

see shadow lines through. In this case, the entire garment is usually lined.

Q. Once permanent press fabrics become stained, the stain is often difficult to remove. How should this fabric be cared for?

A. The manufacturers are diligently working to overcome this quality of permanent press fabrics. It is very difficult and often impossible to remove certain stains from this fabric. Wash garments frequently. They stay fresh looking during wear so there's a tendency to postpone laundering. Once the fabrics become heavily soiled or stained they won't clean easily. Garments are generally most successful when laundered and

tumble dried on a warm synthetic setting. It is very important that garments be removed from the dryer as soon as it stops tumbling. After removing, shake garment and hang on a hanger. Research is now being done at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro on removing stains from permanent press. As for now, try removing stains by using contemporary methods.

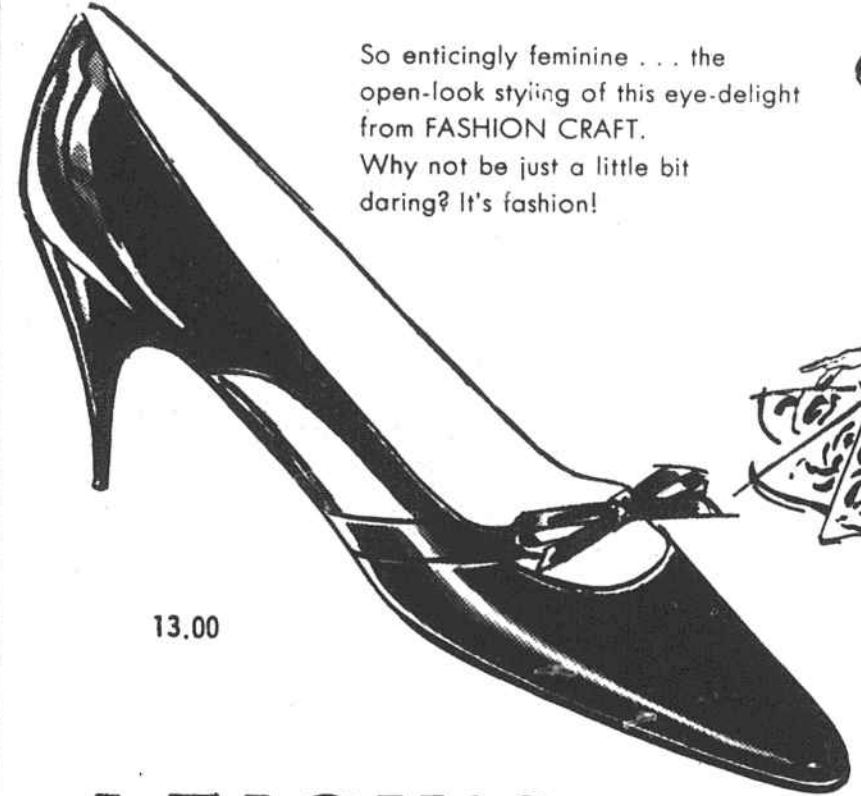
