Namely, an undershirt. But in a few years what the sleeveless undershirt didn't have, its descendant did: World War II. Practically every man in uniform, including every imitator of bare chested movie stars, was wearing a new skivvy shirt.

GI Living Colors

Spread flat and with its stubby sleeves, it looked like a T. It came in a choice of three Gl colors, white for sailors, green for marines, and olive drab for soldiers.

In its way it was closest to a GI's heart, for the civilianized serviceman took the T-shirt home with him.

Marlon Brando immortalized a torn version of the garment when he wore it playing Stanley Kowalski in the stage and movie versions of Tennessee Williams' play, "A
