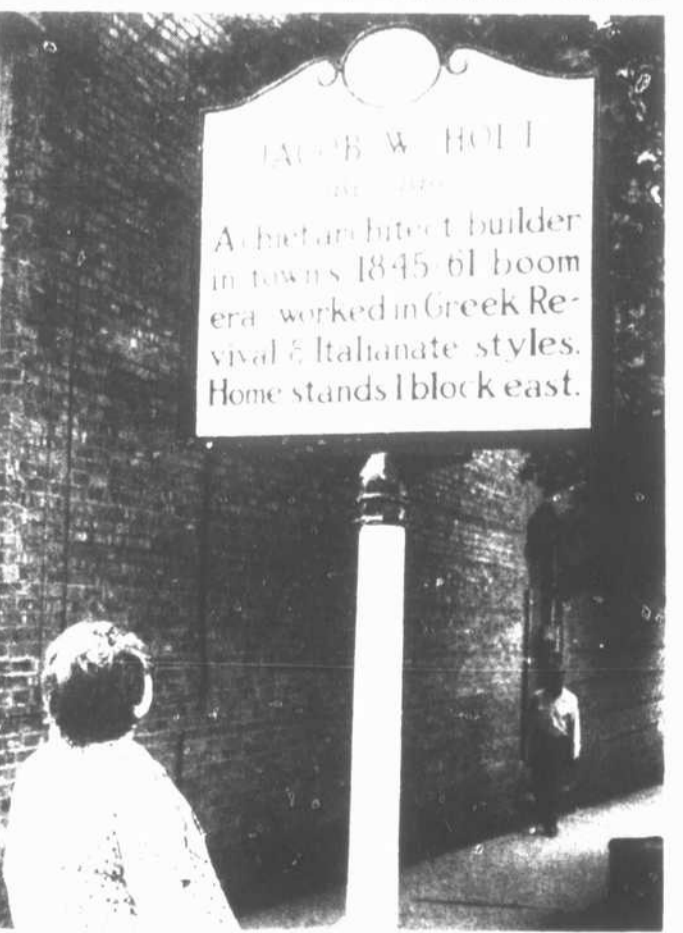
Grand Master Of Masons Pays Official Visit To Lodge
