The commissioners agreed that hereafter the policy should run from June 30 to July 31 in order that any changes may be reflected in budget estimates.

Egerton Rideout said that he would oppose hunting with rifles from highways, but would permit their use from tree stands. Rideout said that there should be some "live and let live" policy in any regulations. Chairman Pete Jones said that he feels that the greatest desire of Warren County citizens is to stop the use of high-power rifles in the county, and other commissioners concurred with him. Chairman Jones also thanked the deer hunters for showing a desire to work with the commissioners in establishing needed regulations.
