Defendant Charged In Court Contempt

A young male defendant was charged with contempt of court during Friday's mixed session of district court. Judge Linwood T. Peoples of Henderson ordered Richard Hargrove confined in jail for 30 days after he appeared in court under the influence of intoxicating beverage. He was found guilty of unlawfully, willfully and contemptuously interrupting court proceedings during the setting of district court. The case against him, assault on a female, was continued.

In other cases coming before the court, the following were disposed of:

Hugh Johnson Ayscue, Jr., nonsupport, continued until Judge People's next day in court pending investigation into the defendant's earnings with orders that he pay \$15 for support of his minor children.

Early Boyd, probation violation, final forfeiture on bond paid in amount of \$75 by bondsman with order of arrest issued for appearance of defendant in district court with bond set at \$3,000.

Bernell Bullock, no operator's license, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Jan. 21 with bond set at \$200.

Ernest H. Davis, nonsupport, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Judge People's next day with bond set at \$1000.

Thomas Davis, forgery and uttering. Defendant waived right to preliminary hearing and ordered to appear at next criminal session of Superior Court to answer charge with bond set at \$400.

Willie Lee Durham, nonsupport, ordered to jail for six months and assigned to work under supervision of N. C. Department of Corrections. Notice of appeal given to next criminal session of Superior Court with bond set at \$1000.

Ivey Felts, public drunkenness, continued until Judge People's next day in February.

Annie Belle Henderson, disposing of mortgaged property. Attorney for defendant made motion for dismissal of charges and case dismissed upon failure of prosecuting witness to make case.

Floyd Hood, disposing of mortgaged property. Attorney for defendant made motion for dismissal of charges and case dismissed after prosecuting witness could not make case.

Clemson Leon Kearney, assault with deadly weapon, and assault on female, ordered to jail for one year and assigned to work under supervision of N. C. Department of Corrections. Notice of appeal given to next criminal session of Superior Court with bond to remain in effect.

Mertis Meadows, worthless check, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Jan. 21 with bond set at \$200.

Haywood L. Montague, no operator's license, final forfeiture of bond and voluntary dismissal taken by state.

Henry Clark Richardson, driving while license revoked and driving under influence, ordered to jail for not less than 12 months nor more than 24 months and assigned to work under supervision of N. C. Department of Corrections with recommendation that he be treated for alcoholism while in

prison. Notice of appeal given to next criminal session of Superior Court with bond set at \$1000.

Henry Richardson, trespass, not guilty.

Clarence Shearin, assault on female, ordered to jail for six months and assigned to work under supervision of Department of Corrections suspended for one year on condition that he remain of good behavior and not violate any State or Federal laws and pay court costs.

William Lewis Southerland, nonsupport, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Jan. 21 with bond set at \$1000.

Janie Laverne Talley, careless and reckless driving and no operator's license, found guilty of careless and reckless and not guilty of other charge, fined \$22 and court costs.

Victor E. Walden, three charges of worthless checks, ordered to jail for 30 days with each other charge to run concurrent at expiration of 30 days. Notice of appeal given to next criminal session of Superior Court with bond set at \$500.

Albert Watkins, assault with deadly weapon, ordered to jail for nine months and assigned to work under supervision of N. C. Department of Corrections with credit for 14 days confinement in jail pending trial granted. Weapon ordered confiscated and disposed of according to law.
