

Work Of Registrars To Give College Aid

The work of registrars in Warren County's 14 voting precincts will increase the prospects of a needy student attending college.

Efforts of the registrars, and their counterparts across the state have resulted in the presentation of \$3,500 in scholarships made available by the News Election Service of New York to the association of North Carolina's chief county election officers.

Mrs. Miriam T. Coleman, executive secretary of the Warren County Board of elections, was complimentary of the efforts of county registrars, and said scholarship money in this area will be turned over to Louisburg College.

A committee of the N. C. Association of County Election Board Executive Secretaries will select recipients from nominations made by executive secretaries around the state.

News Election Service is the cooperative election reporting agency organized by the major news-gathering organizations in the country, ABC News, The Associated Press, CBS News, NBC News and United Press International. NES tabulates and distributes election returns to these five companies for transmittal to virtually every daily newspaper and broadcast station in the country.
