Foods bake faster in glass ovenware than in shiny metal pans because the glass collects and holds the heat instead of reflecting it. When baking in glass, reduce oven temperature at least 25 degrees Fahrenheit unless the recipe states it was written for use with glass ovenware.



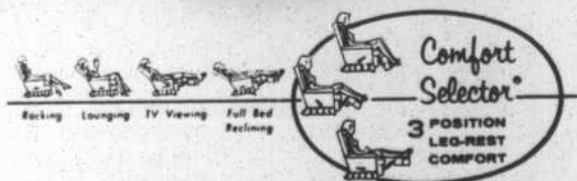

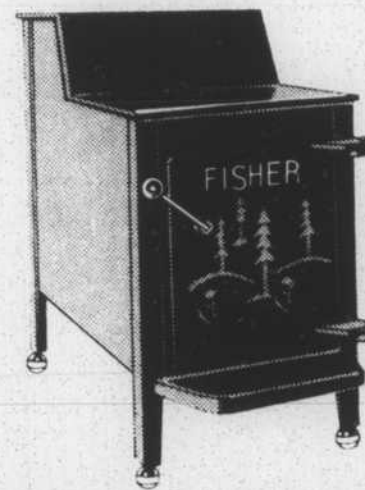
