What is the liability of a hotel for the property of a guest that

In North Carolina a hotel cannot be held liable for loss or guest unless the loss results from the failure of the hotel to exercise ordinary care. Even then the hotel cannot be used for an amount in excess of \$100 if required notices have been posted.

However, if a guest notifies the hotel in writing that his property exceeds \$100 in value, and furnishes it with a list of the property and its value the hotel may be held liable for any loss or damage to the property resulting from negligence on its



Mulch will help conserve moisture, keep soil insulated against the summer heat and help reduce weed problems.


