The first annual Warren County Special Olympics took place Friday, April 1, at North Warren School. It was a joint effort of the Warren County public schools, the area mental health program and the Warren County Jaycees.

The olympics provided athletic competition in various events for individuals enrolled in the special classes of the Warren County School System and the Warren County Child Development Center. The olympics are sponsored nationally by the Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr., Foundation.

Activities began with opening remarks by J. R. Peeler, school superintendent, W. L. Rose, North Warren principal. Jaycee president Tom Peele, and former olympic participant Chuck Simmons. All cited the efforts that had made the olympics possible and expressed the hope of continuing the program in the coming years. Mrs. Heath Beckwith, Director of Pupil Personnel Services for the county schools, who was unable to attend, was mentioned as being instrumental in bringing the olympics to Warren County.
