Following the service, the men of the church will cook breakfast with each family providing eggs, bacon or sausage. The ladies of the church will bring biscuits.

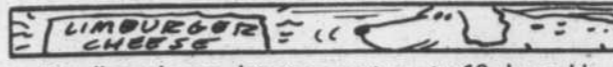
