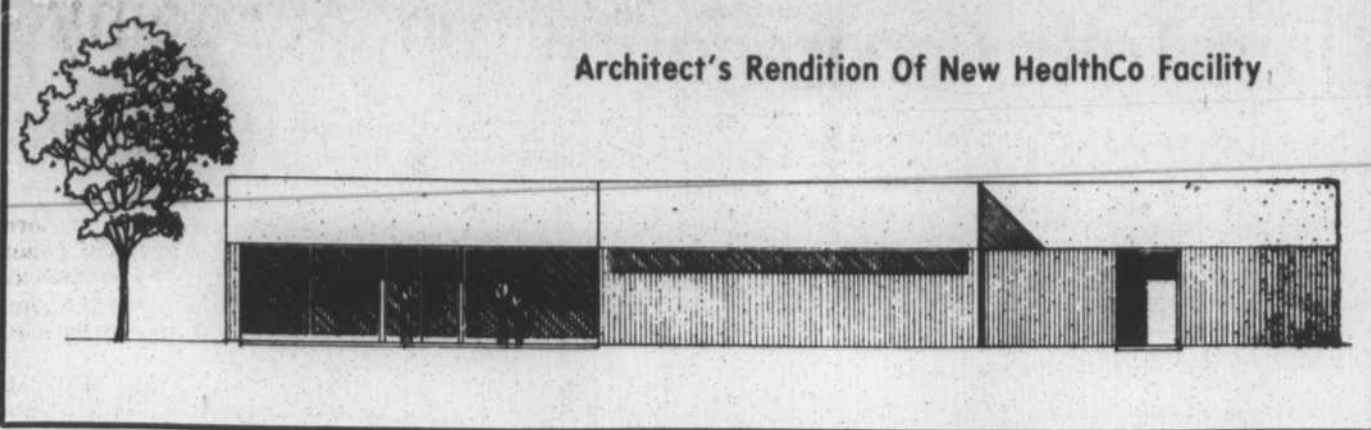


Architect's Rendition Of New HealthCo Facility



## HealthCo Directors Approve New Plans

Architects' drawings of a 5,300-square-foot health facility to be built in Soul City have been approved by HealthCo's Board of Directors.

Hubert Advent, director of the Warren County health facility, said the drawings will be submitted to HEW officials in Atlanta this month for final review and

approval. If approved by HEW, construction on the building will begin this summer with a January 1978 completion date.

HealthCo is now housed in a group of trailers in Soul City.

The main objective of the facility is to provide "high quality health services in the most effective and

efficient manner," according to Advent. The health facility is designed to provide a complete array of dental and medical services to the residents of Warren and Vance Counties.

Cost of the new structure has been estimated in excess of \$200,000.

During the month of March HealthCo treated

over 1,000 patients in the clinic. Another 37 local residents received home health care services by HealthCo nurses on the average of two visits per month.

HealthCo is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. and is open on Saturday from 9 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.

initiate with COG an application for a government grant to complete needed work on the town's sewer lagoon.

Mayor Perry said that he had a pet project in the building of a mini-park on the lower end of the lot occupied by the medical office of Dr. Coffman.

Mrs. Mae Gums, Town Clerk, said that she had a pet project of her own and that was to install a six inch water pipe and six hydrants on a stretch of the town leading from Jack Hawks Car Wash for a distance of .3 of a mile. She said the cost would be \$35,000 but it was not revealed whether this was to be paid by government grant or taxes.

Mayor Perry said that he would also like to see Norlina have a new municipal building, but he had no immediate plans for this beyond the need for hiring a person whose sole duties would be to investigate the possibility of obtaining

## Norlina-Oine Road Eyed For Industry

Future industrial development of Warren County is apt to occur along a corridor between Norlina and Oine, County Manager Charles Hayes told county business leaders and industrial developers for the State of North Carolina meeting here Friday.

The occasion was the annual golf outing for the state's main industry hunters, and many of them agreed with Hayes' assessment that the road between Norlina and Oine on Interstate 85 offers a fertile avenue for industry.

Hayes said that prospects for locating industry along the road are not immediate, since water and sewer lines would have to be laid along the entire two-mile stretch.

The county manager expressed hope that a \$4 billion public works appropriations bill (which was sent to President Carter by

the House of Representatives May 3) would include funds for placing a water line from Soul City to Warrenton, by way of Norlina. It is hoped that a feeder line would be extended from Norlina to Oine.

Hayes also offered descriptions of a half-dozen existing sites lying from Littleton to Manson to developers and business leaders who began arriving at the Warrenton Golf Club about 9:30 Friday.

By 11:30 their ranks had swelled to almost 70, and later many stayed to join foursomes arranged for an afternoon of play.

## Bishop Will Address Guests At Open House

The Child Development Center in Warrenton will hold Open House today (Thursday) starting at 1:30 p.m.

Bishop Robert Fraser, of the Diocese of North Carolina will be guest speaker for the occasion.

The Child Development Center is funded by the All Saints Episcopal Church and the Area Mental Health Program. Warren County children from ages 3-17 attend the center that opened in September, 1976. Eleven students are now enrolled.

Faith Becker, director, said that the open house is being held to give parents and the general public a chance to see the center in operation.

Other special guests will include Julian Farrar, director of Social Service in Warren County; Don Everett, director of the Kerr-Tar Council of Government; and Carroll Gray, director of the Area Mental Health Program.

The purpose of the center is to provide comprehensive educational programs for handicapped children. This

includes social, academic, physical and language skills.

Ms. Becker urges all parents of students attending the center to attend the open house and to bring a friend. Refreshments will be served.

## Practices Affect Yield

Fertilizer injury is one of the major causes of poor stands and irregular growth of flue-cured tobacco, according to North Carolina State University agricultural extension crop specialists.

Placing the fertilizer too close to the roots is the primary cause of injury. The NCSU specialists say that tests and grower experience over a long period of time indicate that best results are obtained when the fertilizer is placed three to five inches from the roots.

Four methods of application have been studied on 42 on-farm locations throughout the flue-cured area of North Carolina in the last five years. These treatments included broadcast, one band, two bands applied at transplanting and two bands 10 days after transplanting.

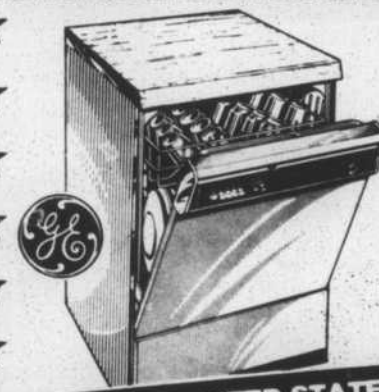
