Questions Answered About Beef Board

Could The Secretary Of Agriculture Appoint People Of His Own Choosing To The Beef Board?

No way. Eligible producer organizations will nominate members to the Board, to be confirmed by the Secretary. He cannot make appointments from any other source. Why Is A 68-Member Beef Board Needed?

We have a large and diverse industry. Each state with 500,000 head or more is entitled to a member on the Board, plus one additional member for each additional 2.5 million head of cattle. An executive committee of 7 to 11 members will conduct routine business within the policies of the Beef Board.

Could Organizations That Might Not Work For The **Program Monopolize The Board?**

Not likely. The eligibility of organizations which might nominate board members is spelled out in the Act, including such factors as nature and size of the organization's active membership, proportion of total membership that are cattlemen, evidence of stability and permanency, ability and willingness to further the aims of the Act, etc. If more than one organization in a state is eligible to nominate, they may caucus to nominate members for the Beef Board.

When Will We Know Which Organizations May Nominate Members For The Board?

Within 90 days after the referendum, which should be in the spring of 1977.

What Effect Will This Have On State Beef Councils? The Act specifies that this program shall not interfere with any existing state beef board or beef council. Up to 10% of net assessments (the total calculated assessments less refunds) from each state will be returned to the qualifying state beef council in that state. In addition.





some state beef councils should qualify as contracting organizations (for additional funds) for specific programs in their states.

Can Dairy Organizations Qualify As Contracting **Organizations?**

Yes, if their program furthers the intent of the Act. About 20% of the beef in the U.S. comes from dairy animals.

How To Vote In The Referendum

How Will A Producer Vote In The Referendum?

First, he must register with the ASCS in the county where his cattle are located and certify that he has owned cattle during the past 12 months. Then, after a two-week waiting period, he may vote FOR or AGAINST the program at the ASCS office. Absentee forms, for registration and for voting, will be available upon request.

Will A Producer's Wife Or Children Be Allowed To Vote In The Referendum?

If the cattle are joint property, there will be one vote per entity and either the man or wife may vote. (Same applies for a corporation or partnership-one vote per producing entity.) However, if a wife or child is a bona fide cattleman independent of the family operation, he or she may vote independently.

Why Do We Need A Law To Get This Job Done?

Some states now have checkoff programs but they are not uniform. This is an attempt to get a uniform collection so every beef producer pays his fair share. Furthermore, beef is a national commodity and a national program is needed to reach the masses of consumers in the big population centers.

You Can Get Your Money Back

Can A Producer Get His Money Back?

Yes, simply by writing to the Beef Board and supplying evidence of how much he paid in assessments. If Producers Grow Unhappy With The Program, Can They Terminate It?

Yes, upon request of 10% of the number of voters in the initial referendum, the Secretary must conduct another referendum; then he must terminate the order if a majority of those voting favor termination.




