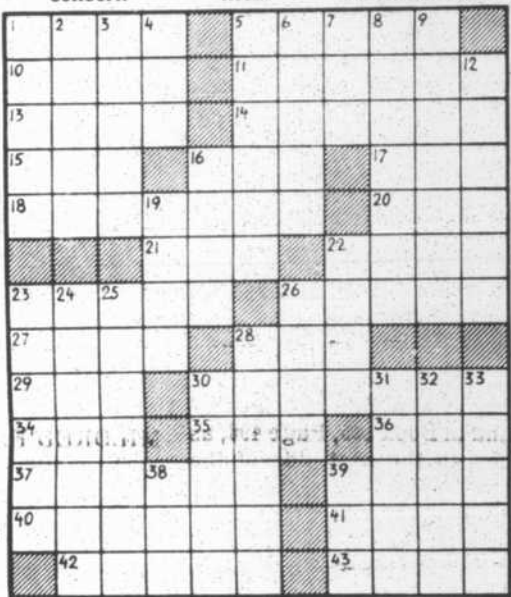

Delicious Ice Cream Is Good For You, Too

With milk production up about 2 1/2 per cent over last year, supplies of dairy products, including ice cream, are in abundance.

Not only is ice cream a delicious summertime dessert, in each scoop are important food nutrients such as protein, calcium and Vitamins A and B2, say agricultural extension specialists at North Carolina State University.

The United States Department of Agriculture sets standards of identity for ice cream products. To be labeled ice cream, they must contain a minimum of 10 per cent milkfat and 20 per cent total milk solids.

This doesn't mean, however, that there isn't a richer ice cream on the market if you prefer it. Rich ice cream can have as high as 16 per cent milkfat content.

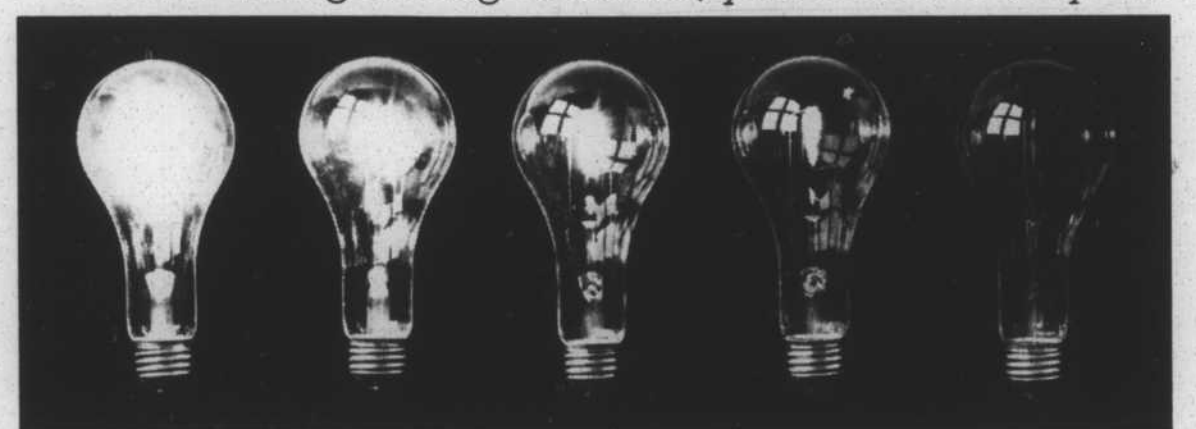

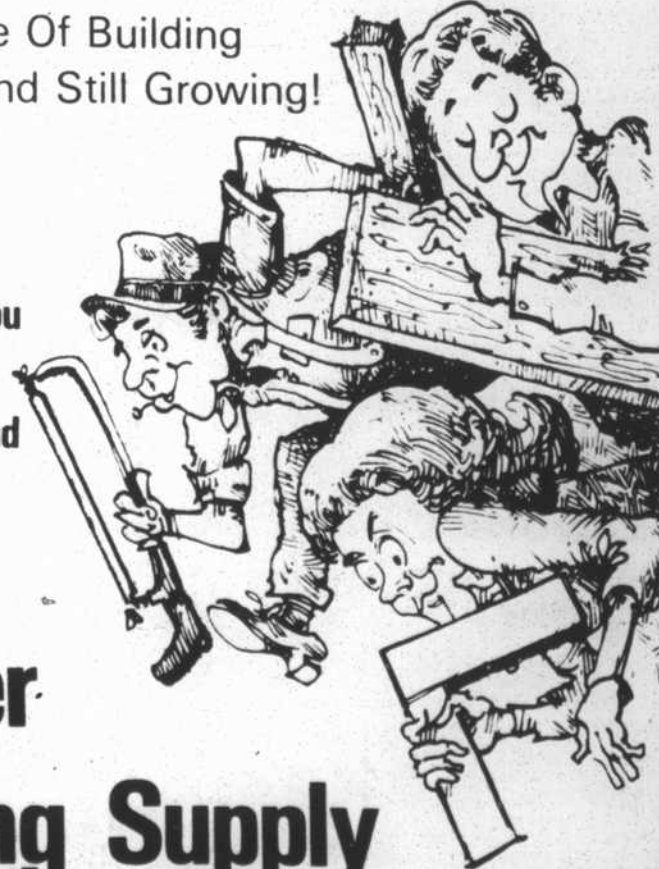
