

Judge Allen Presides Over Mixed Term Of District Court

Judge Claude W. Allen, Jr., of Oxford presided over a lengthy mixed session of Warren County District Court on Friday. The docket contained 74 cases and only 14 were continued. Cases disposed of included:

Joseph Lee Alston of Castalia pled guilty to charges of driving under the influence of intoxicants and driving while license revoked and ordered to jail for not less than eight months nor more than 12 months, suspended for three months on the condition that he pay fine of \$350 and court costs, surrender operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways of North Carolina until allowed to do so by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Herman Odell Boyd of Warren County, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 30 with bond set at \$100.

Morris Bridges of New York, speeding 90 in 55 mph zone, called and failed. Bond of \$100 ordered forfeited.

Norman Carroll of Warren County, speeding 80 in 55 mph zone, found guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, fined \$50 and court costs.

Pequita H. Clements of Vance County, failure to see safe movement, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 30 with bond set at \$100.

Warner M. Clements Jr., of Virginia, operating boat without lights, voluntary dismissal.

Willis Ghuo Cooper, Halifax County, driving under influence of intoxicating liquor, ordered to jail for 90 days, suspended for 12 months on the condition that he pay fine of \$150 and court costs, surrender operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways for 12 months except by limited driving privilege.

William R. Crump of Warren County, injury to personal property and trespass, voluntary dismissal granted on both charges.

James Hayes of Warren County, assault by pointing gun, voluntary dismissal.

was found guilty of false, frivolous and malicious prosecution and ordered to pay costs of court after Wilbert Jones was charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

Clyde Ray King of Warren County was found guilty of exceeding safe speed and death by vehicle and was ordered to jail for 16 months, suspended for two years and placed on probation for two years under the usual terms of probation with special conditions that for 90 days he not drink any alcoholic beverages and that for two years he not be found guilty of any crime involving alcohol, fined \$300 and court costs. Notice of appeal given to next criminal session of Superior Court with no bond set.

Thelma Glass Langford from Georgia called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 30 with bond set at \$100.

Tamara Aiken Matheson of Statesville pled guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone instead of speeding 81 in 55 mph zone as charged, and fined \$55.

Bebe S. Mayer of Pennsylvania was called and failed on charges of speeding 75 in 55 mph zone. Bond of \$50 forfeited.

Earl Howard Maynard of Warren County entered a plea of guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone after being charged with speeding 84 in 55 mph zone, and was ordered to pay \$65 fine and court costs.

Lucille Meadows of Warren County was granted a voluntary dismissal on larceny charges.

Ernest Edward McCoy of Wake County pled guilty to speeding 70 in 55 mph zone after being charged with speeding 75 in 55 mph zone, fined \$65 and court costs.

Douglas John McMullen, II, of Mecklenburg County, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone was called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 16 with bond set at \$100.

Harold Lloyd Norman, of High Point, speeding 81 in 55 mph zone, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 30 with bond set at \$100.

Walter Clayton Paynter of Warren County, prayer for judgment continued upon payment of court costs for charges of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone.

Jerry Warren Pendergrass of Vance County, assault on female, court costs.

William Taylor Pernel of Warren County, failure to drive right half of highway, fined \$25 and court costs.

Willie Charles Peterson, of Mecklenburg County, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 30 with bond set at \$100.

Walter M. Pitchford, of Warren County, worthless check, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on Sept. 2 with bond set at \$100.

Edward Keith Powell entered a plea of exceeding a safe speed and no operator's license after he was charged with careless and reckless driving and no operator's license. The Warren County man was fined \$15 and court costs.

Junice Manning Reid of Warren County, was found

guilty of speeding 80 in 55 mph zone instead of speeding 95 in 55 mph zone as charged and was ordered to the Department of Correction for 20 days, suspended for 12 months on the condition that she pay fine of \$85 and court costs, surrender operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways for 60 days except as allowed by limited driving privilege and not be found guilty of speeding for 12 months.

William Richardson, Jr., of Hollister, careless and reckless driving, fined \$35 and court costs.

Ellsworth B. Sessoms from Virginia was found guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone after charges of speeding 77 in 55 mph zone and fined \$40 and court costs.

James Seward of Warren County entered a plea of guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone instead of 78 in 55 mph zone and was fined \$40 and court costs.

Howard Craig Sharpe, Jr. of Mecklenburg County, speeding 100 in 55 mph zone, possession of marijuana, found guilty to speeding 88 in 55 mph zone and possession of marijuana, ordered to jail for 90 days, suspended for 12 months on the condition that he pay fine of \$65 in the marijuana charge, \$100 in the speeding charge and court costs, surrender operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways of North Carolina for 12 months.

Clarence McDona Sledge, of Warren County, speeding 74 in 55 mph zone, pled guilty of speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, fined \$35 and court costs.

Carlton Smith, assault on female, voluntary dismissal.

Nancy Smith and Forest Eugene Vaughan, fornication and adultery, voluntary dismissal.

Forrest Eugene Vaughan, assault, voluntary dismissal. On assault of officer charge, court costs.

James Shephard Spruill, of Warren County failure to see safe movement and failure to stop at scene of accident, found guilty of failure to see safe movement, fined \$20 and court costs.

Charles Carson Stanley from Virginia was found guilty of speeding 79 in 55 mph zone after being charged with speeding 90 in 55 mph zone. He was ordered to jail for 90 days, suspended for six months on the condition that he pay fine of \$75 and court costs and not operate a motor vehicle on highways of N. C. for four months.

Larry Dean Talley was found guilty of assault on female and ordered to jail for 180 days, suspended for two years on the condition that he pay fine of \$15 and court costs and not be found guilty of any crime involving assault on his wife for two years.

Anderson Terry of Warren County, worthless check, voluntary dismissal.

A voluntary dismissal was granted Eddie Valentine on charges of nonsupport.

Anthony Kelly Vaughan of Warren County, pled guilty to speeding 50 in 35 mph zone when his case of speeding 55 in 35 mph zone was called. He was ordered to pay fine of \$10 and court

costs.

Nathan Watkins, Jr., of Warren County was found guilty of speeding 65 in 55 mph zone and no operator's license and ordered to jail for four months, suspended for 12 months on the condition that he pay fine of \$75 and court costs and not operate motor vehicle on highways of N. C. for 12 months without valid operator's license.

Edwin Heath Williams, of Knightdale, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone. The defendant through counsel waived the formal presentation of the evidence and was ordered to pay fine of \$20 and court costs. Notice of appeal given to the next criminal session of Superior Court with bond to remain in effect.

Robert G. Wolfson of New York and Durham was charged with speeding 83 in 55 mph zone and called and failed. Bond on \$50 was forfeited.

Ace Silver of Warren County appearing on a bastardy charge stated that he was the father of the child and that he had not paid any support. He was given prayer for judgment for four years on the condition that

he pay into the office of Clerk of Superior Court \$15 each week for the support of the child with the court recommending that his probation not be violated for this incident.

Johnny C. White, driving while license revoked, careless and reckless driving, speeding 68 in 55 mph zone and no operator's license, ordered to jail for 10 months, suspended for two years on the condition that he pay fine of \$265 and court costs and not operate motor vehicle on highways without valid license.

In the case of Robert McNeil on a bond forfeiture charge, the court found that the defendant should pay \$100 instead of the \$500 as adjudged in an earlier court hearing.

August 26, 1932—The U.S. government proclaims a moratorium on foreclosures by the holders of first mortgages, thereby attempting to ease the plight of householders during the dark days of the Depression.
