October was a typical fall month, according to the weather statistics reported by Clarence Skillman of Arcola this week. Pleasant temperatures ranged in the 60's during most days.

Skillman reported 16 days with temperatures in the 60's and 10 days when the mercury rose to the 70's. The thermometer read in the 40's, 50's and 80's on only two days each.

Skillman reported a high of 87 degrees Oct. 3, with 31 degrees reported as the low on Oct. 18.

The heaviest rainfall during the month was during the latter part with 3.14 inches falling on Oct. 27. The gauge indicated 7.20 inches of rainfall during the month, Skillman said.
