### Flu Shots Available

The Warren County Health Department will be giving flu vaccine any Tuesday from 8:30 a. m. to 5 p. m.

Again, this year if you are 65 or older, or who regardless of age suffer from such chronic conditions as heart disease, bronchitis, bronchiectasis, tuberculosis, emphysema, kidney disease, diabetes and other chronic metabolic diseases you are encouraged to be a candidate for the vaccine.

The high risk people, as

listed, are especially vulnerable to flu because in their weakened condition they often get complications such as pneumonia.

Medical authorities say the prevalent flu germs this year will be A-Bangkok, A-Brazil, and B-Singapore. Fortunately, there is an effective vaccine against them.

If you are in the high risk group please get this vaccine either at your private doctor's office or at the Health Department. The fee at the Health Department will be \$5.00.
