Family Week Focuses On 'People Factory'

Thanksgiving week is National Family Week, but what is a family really all about?

"A family," says Dr. Leo Hawkins, extension human development specialist at North Carolina State University, "is a factory where people are made." "As we understand the feelings, needs and patterns in the family factory, we then begin to build a true human being," Hawkins elaborates.

And there is a great deal involved in that human being, says Hawkins. He must take care of his physical condition; be real and honest to self and others; take risks; be creative and competent and know how to change when the situation calls for it.

"When you add all this up, you have a physically healthy, mentally alert, feeling, loving, playful, authentic, creative and productive human being," the specialist says.

There are four aspects of family life which help ensure the development of such a person and a strong family.

In a vital and nurturing family, self worth is high; communication is direct and honest; rules are appropriate and flexible

and linkage to society is open and hopeful.

In families in trouble, Hawkins says, these facets are missing or not fully developed.

"No matter what kind of problem a family has," Hawkins says, "the prescription is the same. To relieve family pain, some way has to be found to change these four key factors."

These things are true, Hawkins says, whether the family is a natural one; a one-parent one; a blended step or adoptive one or an institutional one with a group of children.

So although the outer shell of the "family factories" may differ, the inside product and the formula for creating it, are much the same.
