A native of Wake County, Montague graduated from Wake Forest College and Wake Forest Law School. After service in World War II and graduation from law school, Montague entered the private practice of law in Raleigh. Soon thereafter, he accepted a position as revisor of statutes with the attorney general's office.

In 1956, he became administrative assistant to the chief justice. While in that capacity, he also functioned as executive secretary of the Judicial Council

With the advent of court reform and the resulting unification of the courts and centralization of management, Montague became the first assistant director of the newlyestablished Administrative Office of the Courts under Judge J. Frank Huskins. In 1968, he was appointed state court administrator

He served as a member of the State Constitution Study Commission in 1968, Governor's Crime Commission, the Commission on Youth Services, the Courts Commission, and the Judicial Planning Committee. Since 1974, he has been a member of the board of directors of the State Employees' Credit Union, serving as chairman of the board from 1979-81.




