Judge J. Larry Senter of Franklinton presided over the May 26 session of Warren County District Court, disposing of the following cases:

Carl Johnson, abandonment and non-support, voluntary dismissal.

Jessie James Rudd, failure to comply, defendant allowed to pay \$25 per month until paid in full.

Mavis Southerland, failure to comply, defendant allowed to pay \$100 on May 26 and \$50 per month until paid in full.

William M. Bullock, communicating threats, ordered to jail for not less than four months and not more than six months, suspended for two years on condition he pay \$25 and costs and not assault, threaten or bother in any way Gloria Bullock during suspension.

Willie White, two counts of murder, court found probable cause and defendant bound over to next session of Warren County Superior Court. No bond allowed, defendant allowed to go to Dorothea Dix Hospital for evaluation and upon his release ordered to be placed with the Department of Corrections for safe-keeping pending his trial.

Ervin Hargrove, intoxicated and disruptive in public, ordered to jail for not less than 10 days and not more than 15 days, suspended for 12 months on condition he pay \$25 and costs and not be drunk in public during suspension.
