

Senter Presides Over Session Of District Court

Judge J. Larry Senter of Franklinton presided over the August 25 session of Warren County District Court, disposing of the following cases:

McKinley Silver, bastardy, voluntary dismissal.

Glenn Fields, two counts of failure to comply, called and failed, arrest order issued and bond set at \$500.

Abraham Shearin, communicating threats, ordered to jail for not less than four months nor more than five months, suspended for 12 months on condition he pay \$75 fine and costs.

Pressure Cooking Can Save Time, Nutrients

If you're one of those "not-so-proud" pressure saucepan owners, do yourself a favor and pull your pan out of hiding.

Extension home economists at North Carolina State University suggest you read the instructions that came with the pan.

You may be surprised to learn that the pressure pan is easy to use and requires no special training.

Cooking under pressure is an excellent way to preserve food nutrients and color, the specialists point out.

Since foods cook quickly, this method

saves both time and fuel.

It's important to follow the recommended times and pounds of pressure for each food, the specialists add. This information is given in the direction book.

Foods of similar size and tenderness may be cooked in the saucepan. Dividers or aluminum foil keep foods separate. This method is suitable for mild-flavored foods, since odors of strong-flavored foods tend to spread.

If properly prepared, most foods cooked under pressure also retain acceptable flavor.
