Nick Lea who is charged with the burning of J. H. Slade's Dwell-ing house, and who escaped the custody of the officer sometime ago, was arrested this week in Virginia and is now in jail at this place.

White and Cross, the Raleigh bootmakers are out on dail.

The Roman Catholics have 22 Professors of Hebrew in this country, the Presbyterian 21, the Baptist 15, the Methodist 13 the Episcopalian 13.

In 19 counties of Indiana there are 1,132 saloons and in 9 counties there are no saloons. In the 19 counties there is one prisoner for every 72 votes. In the 9 counties there is one for every 720 votes, being 10 times as many where liquor is sold.

A glass of beer costs the consumer 5cts. and there are at least twenty in the gallon and 640 in the barrels. So that beer retails at about \$32 a gallon, while ale costs still more. The consumption of beer and ale last year was about 15,000,000 barrels; cost about \$480,000,000.

The cheapest kind of liquor used, ordinary whiskey is rarely sold at 5cts. and averages at least 7cts. a drink at half a gill to the dram, this makes \$4.58 per gallon.

The consumption last year was 70,000,000 gallons, cost to the consumer about \$313,000,000, adding wine there is certainly spent for spirituous drinks more than \$800,000,000, and the entire sum raised by taxes of all kind, national, state, county, city, town and school district is stated on authority of the census bereau to be not more than \$700,000,000.


