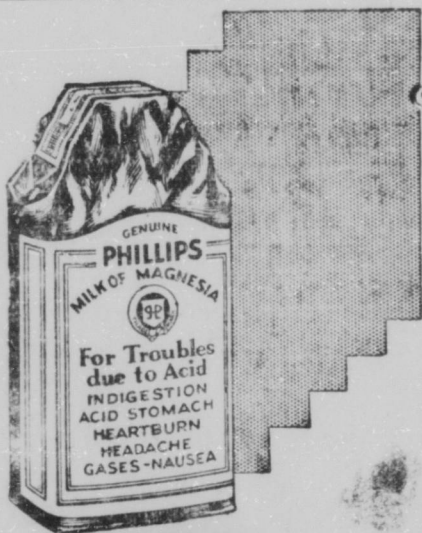

ROOT CUTTINGS NOW

If you have not already put out cuttings of shrubbery to root, do so at once. That is, if you want the shrubs. Nearly all of them can be rooted. Some that are the least trouble to start are abelia, weigela, euonymus and some kinds of spiraea. Boxwoods are much slower to root and to grow and so are all coniferous evergreens. Be sure to put the cuttings in a place where they may be kept moist, and then keep them so.
