**FIRE ZONES AND SIGNALS**

Those who are not already familiar with the fire zones and their signals should save this and memorize it.

The zones all corner at the point where Arendell Street running north and south, crosses Horton Street, running east and west. Each takes in all town territory extending from boundaries given, but does not cross them.

Zone 1—From Citizen's Drug Store to Alford's Store, Signal 1 one long, 1 short.

Zone 2—From Sign-board lot north, Signal 1 long, 2 short.

Zone 3—From Gill Building north, including Wakelon School. Signal 1 long, 3 short.

Zone 4—From Zebulon Drug Store south, including warehouse and oil mill. Signal 1 long, 4 short.

Out of town fires: Signal 1 long.

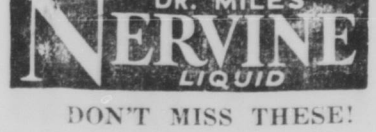
