Nearly everybody has plenty of peas and sweet potatoes, and a lot of them are raising their own meat.

The cane crop is also very good and looks like it will be from 15 to 20 days earlier than it was last year.

After all we have a lot to be thankful for. A good many people are planning to have a wheat patch and try to make their flour at home. No doubt if this community had been living for the last 5 years like they have for the past 12 months the majority of the people would have almost been independent. So come on and let's live at home and make times better for us.

FALL POTATO FOR SEED
Yes—as far as the yield is concerned as the native seed produce as large and sometimes a larger crop than do the northern grown seed. The crop grown from northern seed, however, matures from two to three weeks earlier than that grown from native seed planted at the same time. The difference in time in getting to market and the resulting price difference is favorable to the northern grown seed.
