 The tobacco prospects in this section are indeed poor. After a careful survey I find that there is not more than 35 per cent of last year's crop planted. The greater part of the crop is young tobacco and is suffering greatly from the prolonged drought. Tobacco is drying up at the bottom at a very rapid rate and is being eaten at the top by an enormous quantity of worms. The average crop of tobacco has little or no body whatever. However, the older tobacco has become quite thick and rough. This makes it almost impossible to cure the tobacco together with any success. Yet, it has to be cured together on account of the short crop. The average farmer does not have enough tobacco to run one barn. In many cases three or four cure in the same barn.
 Under present conditions it is very doubtful if this section produces more than 25 per cent of last year's crop.




