**Officers Elected for Tuberculosis Assn.**

E. N. Pope presided at the regular meeting of the board of directors of the Wake County Tuberculosis Association on Thursday.

New members of the board introduced were Mrs. W. C. Roberts of Rolesville, Mrs. R. C. Nesmith of Milbrook and Mrs. Julian R. Nipper of Leesville. Twenty-six members were present.

Dr. Earl Brian, director of the free diagnostic clinic, gave the clinic report and explained the clinic to new members.

The clinic, which is supported by the Christmas Seal Sale, was responsible for X-raying 904 persons from April 1 to May 19. Of this number, five active cases of tuberculosis were found, and eight cases of non-tuberculosis pathology were referred to physicians and clinics for further study.

The board authorized the purchase of two reels of the film, "Inside Story," to be shown in the Raleigh public schools along with teaching units on tuberculosis.

The \$40,000 spent for sewer and water lines would be the same as a gift to the property owners, for it would increase the worth of the in Wakelon Heights by more than the amount.

Further, the \$40,000 would represent only an initial expenditure. Probably additional improvement would be necessary on the water plant, and the sewage disposal problem would be greater. In addition, police protection and street improvements would have to be provided.

Suggested ways of financing the \$40,000 cost of water and sewer extensions included: 1) the property owners paying a share of the total; 2) the property owners paying the full cost and adding this expense to the sales price of the individual lots; 3) a bond issue; and 4) a piece-meal extension of the water and sewer lines, as the income of the town permits.
