action.

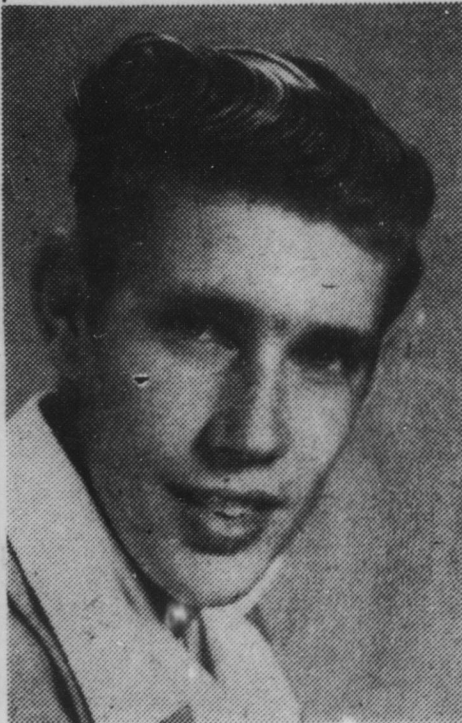
The nature of the relief being
