The following cases were disposed during Recorder's Court session of April 11. Judge Irby Gill was the presiding judge.

Lemon Wilson, charged with giving a worthless check to B. A. Antone in the amount of \$98.25, was given 30 days on the roads suspended upon payment of court costs.

Knightdale, Mark Hinton, charged with speeding 47 mph in a 35 mph zone, was found guilty and given a fine of \$25 and costs.

Washington Denton George pleaded guilty to careless and reckless driving and was given a fine of \$25 and court costs.

Herbert Lester Sholar, Rocky Mount, was ordered to pay a \$10 fine and court costs for improper passing.

Massey is a native of Zebulon, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Guy C. Massey. He graduated from Wakelon High School and attended Campbell College.


