BLOCKADE "HOOTCH." Modern Liquor May Not Kill man But It's Sure Death to Hogs and Buzzards.

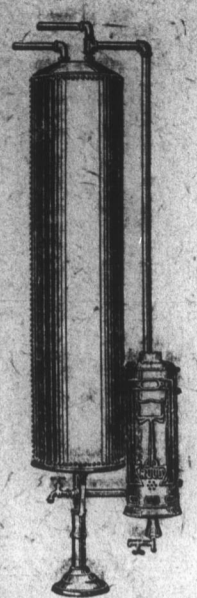
Winston-Salem, April 18.—Although a man may drink modern blockade "hootch" and survive, a hog and a buzzard cannot stand its deadly qualities, according to a discovery made a few days ago by a Forsyth deputy sheriff in the Lewsville section. Mr. Wagoner, the officer, was out looking for moonshine plants when he ran upon a small one made out of a five gallon oil can with a half gallon hard bucket for a cap. The other fixtures were just as crude. Around the still were several old fish tubs in which the beer had been made. The fish odor, combined with that of the de-caying still refuse, created a terrible smell, says the deputy. Leading out from the still, through a wheat field, the officer noticed a path which appeared to have been traveled by both human beings and hogs. Following this path, Mr. Wagoner came upon a dead hog, while close by lay a dead buzzard. The deputy figured out that the hog had visited the still and ate of the refuse and that before it could get very far away sickened and died in its tracks. The death of the buzzard is attributed to its feeding on the carcass of the hog that had eaten the still slop.

\$2,000,500 in Bonds Found in Missouri.

St. Louis, Mo., April 19.—Two million dollars worth of bonds and securities included in the lot taken in a hold-up of an armored mail truck here in April, were recovered late today in a home in St. Louis County several miles west of this city. The loot was recovered in the home of William F. Deering. Unregistered bonds of the St. Louis Federal Land bank to the amount of \$2,138,900 and \$225,000 of other paper, of which \$81,250 were negotiable, were taken by the robbers.
