

All lettuces tend to make heads and in California all do. In some other Sec-tions it takes coaxing to make any of them head. It requires to be grown fast without check, to produce the ten-der, sweet leaves that we enjoy. The soil, then, must be light, quickly warneed, as rich as possible, especial-ly in nitrogen, and there should be a plentiful supply of water. The rich-est spit in your garden should be chosen for lettnee and then it should be manured, if possible, and additional feeding with nitrate of soda is advis-able. able.


