ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by Board of Aldermen of City of Concord: Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to park any automobile on North side of East Depot street between Union street and Church street or to park any automobile on Means street between Union street and the driveway into county jail. Section 2. That any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined fifty dollars or imprisoned 30 days. Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect upon publication. 4-31-c.

ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of City of Concord: Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to leave or park any automobile or other vehicle upon any street within the fire limits of the City of Concord between the hours of 3:30 A. M. and 5:30 A. M. Section 2. That any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined fifty dollars or imprisoned 30 days. Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect upon publication. 4-31-c.
