COMMENCEMENT AT SCOTIA WOMAN'S COLLEGE

Fine Address by Dr. Lucock.— Graduating Exercises Today.
Dr. George Lucock, college pastor of the Westminster College Church, Wooster, Ohio, delivered the annual address to the graduating class of Scotia Woman's College Tuesday night at 7:30.

Full of wholesome advice, delivered in a masterly manner, rich with choice quotations and emphasized with appropriate illustrations, the address held the moderately large audience spell bound from beginning to the end.

Speaking on the "Formation of Character" Dr. Lucock said "Character is the biggest word in the forming of life." In a pleasing and most effective manner he developed his discourse from what he termed "The four corner stones of character." First, the will to be strong. Second, the will to serve. Third, the will to sacrifice. "Character," he said, "can not be bought at any price. One must will to get it."

It was indeed a wonderful address and made a deep impression on the minds of those who heard it.

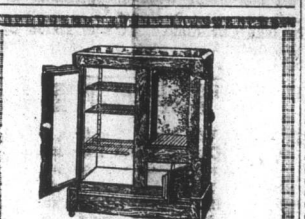
