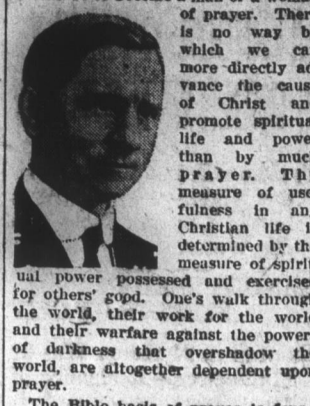

Prayer Paramount

TEXT—Pray without ceasing.—1 Thea. 5:17.



The chief desire of a Christian should be to become a man of a woman of prayer. There is no way by which we can more directly advance the cause of Christ and promote spiritual life and power than by much prayer.

The Bible basis of prayer is found in the relationship that exists between God and His believing people. The sons of men become the sons of God through faith in Jesus Christ.

There is another relationship into which Christians enter, as clearly seen in Rev. 1:5-8, where we read that Christ loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood and made us to be kings and priests unto God.

Prayer is an absolute necessity. Fitness for fruitful service is an outgrowth of prayer. "The achievements of a soldier on the battle field," said General Nogi, hero of Port Arthur, "are nothing but the flowering and fruition of the work and training of his daily life in the time of peace."

Prayer is an infinite privilege. "Prayer changes things." Notwithstanding all that is said by so-called learned men concerning the universe and the reign of law, God is more than creator of the universe; He is the Father of the great family, for whose sake, and in answer to whose requests, He works in a supernatural way, a way unknown to any but the regenerated, a way hidden from the worldly wise, but revealed unto the babes, the born ones. Prayer does change things; believe it, act on it and you will become convinced of its power.

Prayer is a solemn responsibility. Relationship always involves responsibility. This cannot be avoided if you are a child of God. The responsibility is as extensive as the relationship. Prayer is not an obligation for a privileged few, but for all of the children of God.

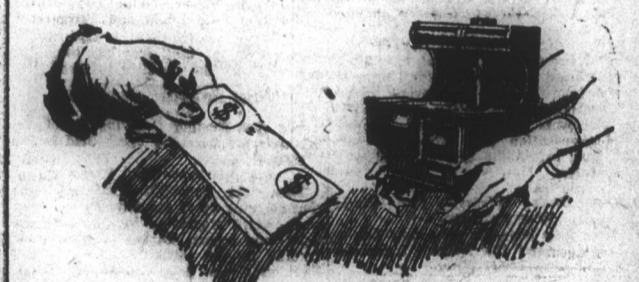
