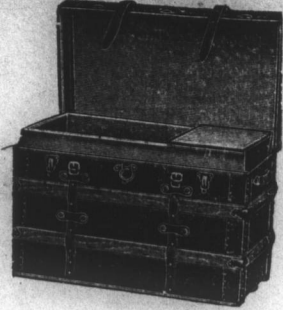

The Concord Chapter American Legion Auxiliary will meet tomorrow—Thursday—evening at 8 o'clock in the Legion Club rooms. All members are asked to be present.

Baseball at Cabarrus Park, Kannapolis, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week, between the Cabarrus Y team and Dad Prim's All Stars from the Blue Ridge League.

Only two cases were on docket for trial in recorder's court this morning. One defendant was charged with speeding and the other with driving an automobile while intoxicated. Everything has been quiet in police circles this week, local officers declare.

Announcement was made here today of the sale of the New South Cafe and Hotel. The former owners, Eugene and Lee Martin, sold out to Christ Pappas. Pappas came to Concord from Laurinburg, and took charge of the cafe and hotel today.

Cement and brick masons have completed the foundation for the building Mr. E. B. Grady is having erected on his lot adjoining his plumbing plant on East Corbin street. Brick masons will start on the walls of the building at once, and work on the structure will be pushed as rapidly as possible.

Fine progress is being made now on the addition being erected to the Cabarrus Motor Company. Practically all of the brick work on the structure has been completed, and carpenters are now engaged on the structure. The building is being erected just in the rear of the present home of the company.

Relatives here have been advised that the condition of Miss Ella Belle Shirley, who underwent an operation in a Charlotte hospital Monday, continues to show slight improvement. A message from Mrs. John M. Cook, sister of Miss Shirley, who is in Charlotte, received here Tuesday afternoon, stated that Miss Shirley seemed to be improving daily.

The funeral of Mr. John Lady, who died Tuesday in Presbyterian Hospital in Charlotte, was held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at Rocky River Presbyterian Church. The services were conducted by Rev. T. H. Spence, pastor of the Church, and interment was made in the Church cemetery. Quite a large number of friends of the deceased, attended their services.

Every one is invited to take part in the program to be carried out at the Southern station tomorrow when the Roanoke Boosters will be welcomed to Concord. The special train carrying the boosters is expected to reach Concord at 1:25 p. m., for a 20 minute stop, and every one who can do so, is asked to be at the station to help extend a hearty welcome to the visitors.

The dentist who has been conducting the dental clinic for colored children of the county, has completed his work in the county and is now in the city. He began his work at the Logan School this morning and will be at this school for the remainder of the month. All children under 14 years of age will be examined by the dentist if they will report to the school building.

All children who have not been previously successfully vaccinated for small-pox before they can enter school this year. This law was pointed out this morning by Dr. S. E. Buchanan, county health officer, who expressed the hope that all children who must be vaccinated would do so before school opens so it will not be necessary to send them home after their school work starts.

The aldermen of the city are expected to fix the city's tax rate when they meet in regular session on the first Thursday night in September. The commissioners probably will fix the county rate at their September meeting. In some quarters it is believed the city tax rate will have to be increased. The tax at present is \$1.00, and some believe it will be raised as high as \$1.15 or \$1.20.

Mr. Geo. R. Pierce of this city received a message Tuesday morning that his nephew, James Carter, aged 7 years, of Roanoke, Va., had been killed in that city by being run over by a truck on Monday afternoon. The little fellow was crossing the street after leaving a picture show, and was instantly killed. Mr. and Mrs. Pierce left last night for Roanoke to attend the funeral which is being held this afternoon at four o'clock.
