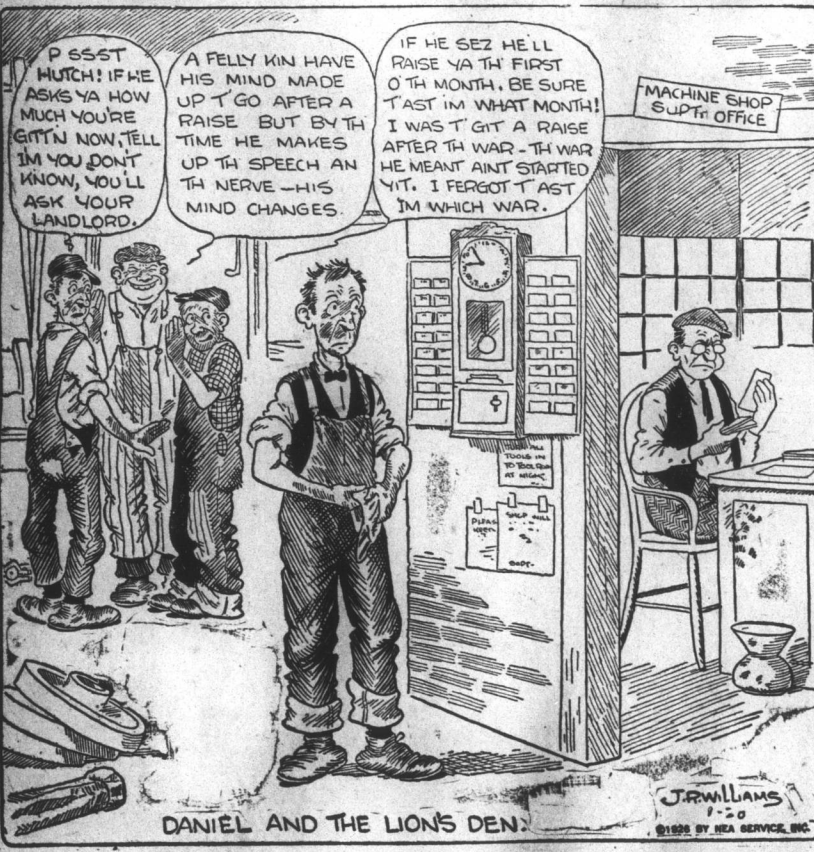
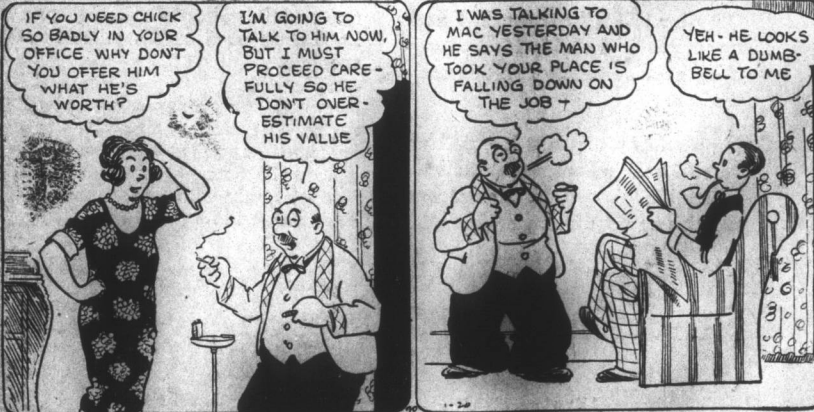

 Washington, Jan. 19.—One thing this season's White House social functions have proven is that the plug title is far from obsolete.  
 That is to say, it's still affected by an overwhelming majority of the president's civilian callers. Of course the army and navy men wear their uniform headgear. With few exceptions the members of the diplomatic corps are uniformed, too, mostly with cocked hats and some with waving plumes, like an old-fashioned hearse.  
 But for ordinary people—ordinary people of consequence, not the hoi polloi, who attend the public receptions—the stovepipe's rule among all who care a cent for appearances.

**NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FOR PROPOSED PARK**  
 State Campaigns Will Be in Full Swing by the First of February.  
 Asheville, N. C., Jan. 20.—With the prospect that the national campaign for funds for the purchase of the Great Smoky Mountains for a national park may begin early in February, the local campaign committee this week will speed up its efforts to complete the quota of \$250,000 for Asheville and Buncombe county, and throughout Western and Central North Carolina local campaigns will be inaugurated. It is the hope of the state campaign committee, which is working at the request of the federal park commission, that the state campaign may be completed by the time the national campaign gets under way.  
 Meetings at Waynesville and Morganton on Friday night indicated lively interest in the national park movement in two counties, which had been reported as apathetic or opposed to the plan to create a national park in the Great Smokies. In Waynesville, where Charles A. Webb, co-publisher of the Asheville Citizen made the chief address an executive committee to take charge of the campaign in Haywood County was organized. In Morganton, where State Representative Harry Nettle of Biltmore made the chief presentation, it was stated that the city and county were ready to do their part when ever the state campaign committee was ready to perfect the organization.  
 On Tuesday noon, first steps to start the campaign in Hendersonville will be taken. A meeting has been called at one o'clock at the Old Kentucky Home by H. Walter Fuller, county chairman. At this time the campaign organization, which is to raise the pre-arranged \$25,000 for Henderson county, will be fully effected.
