## FLAPPERS' ISSUE IS SETTLED IN A CLASS

Cleveland High School Seniors Bring Problem to Course in Personality. Cleveland, April 7—What a young girl should know—to get along in the world—is being taught in a new course of training in the development of personality and building of character at the John Adams high school. Gentlemen may prefer blondes, but the brunettes want to know why. Students bring their problems to call, and all hands pitch in to find the solution.

The course, as outlined by Miss Margaret Collins, head of the home economics department, went into effect at the beginning of the last semester, and at present is open only to girls in the 11B class of the commercial group. But next year all the senior girls probably will be permitted to take the course, and other high schools may follow suit. These general subjects are taught by Miss Dorothy Jones and Miss Alma Probeck: health, foods, clothing and personal appearance, thrift, social relationships, recreation and social and personal development.
