Tickets for the Charlotte automobile races May 10th will be on sale in Concord one day only, tomorrow, Friday, April 30th, at the Reid Motor Co. Get yours tomorrow.

Miss Theresa Damsell, expert in children's diet, will speak here twice tomorrow. At 3:30 she will be heard at Central School and at 7:30 at No. 2 school. The public is invited to hear her.

Officers of the American Legion request that business houses and homes of the city display their flags on May 5th and 6th while the War Mothers are holding their State convention in Concord.

The Poplar Tent and St. John's schools will close their year's work tomorrow afternoon. These are two of the last schools in the county to close. Exercises will be held at the schools tomorrow night.

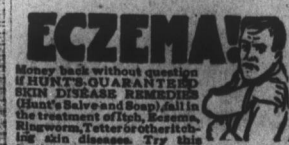
