One new case of German measles was reported this morning to the county health department.

J. P. Cook, of Concord, was chosen at the State Democratic convention in Raleigh Thursday as a member of the State executive committee from the eighth district.

The movie program at the Y. M. C. A. tomorrow night will be shown on the lawn if the weather is favorable. Special features have been secured for the program, which will begin at 7:30.

The general public is invited to hear the Bible Story contests on Sunday. At 4:30 the Group C finals will be held in the First Presbyterian church and at 7:30 the Group D finals will be held in the First Baptist Church.

J. W. Cannon, J. A. Cannon and W. M. Sherrill, of this city, have been named along with a number of other men of the state, as delegates from North Carolina to the Sesqui-Centennial celebration in Philadelphia from June 1st to December 31st.

It is probable that a number of Concord and Cabarrus county people will go to Hickory next week to attend the western division meeting of the State Sunday School Association. The convention will be in session on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

All members of the "Sunday Gang" are expected to attend the meeting at the Y Sunday afternoon at 3:30. An hour later they will march in a body to the First Presbyterian Church to hear contestants in Group C of the Bible Story Contest.

Only two cases are docketed for trial in recorder's court this afternoon, police officers state. One defendant is charged with being intoxicated and the other with having liquor. Several other cases originally scheduled for trial today have been continued.

A special meeting of the Fred Y. McConnell Post of the American Legion will be held tonight at 8 o'clock in the club rooms. In addition to business matters to be presented, members present will enjoy refreshments which have been provided. All members are urged to attend.

Tax listers of the county are scheduled to begin their duties tomorrow. Prof. J. W. B. Long is tax supervisor of the county again this year and he plans to start the listers on their duties tomorrow. All property owners are expected to list their taxes during the month of May.

Rain is badly needed in this section of the state. Farmers and garden owners are finding the dry weather detrimental to their crops and persons with flower gardens are finding it difficult to keep the flowers in bloom. It is said that the entire western part of the state needs rain now.

Members of the high school orchestra left this morning in autos for Greensboro to compete in the contest for high school orchestras from all parts of the State. The local orchestra has made an enviable reputation during the year and expects to win first honors at the Greensboro contest.

The poultry meeting at the court house tomorrow afternoon will begin at 2:30. Dr. B. F. Kaupp, of State College, will deliver the principal address and others will speak briefly. The meeting here has been arranged in connection with "National Egg Day" which will be observed throughout the country tomorrow.

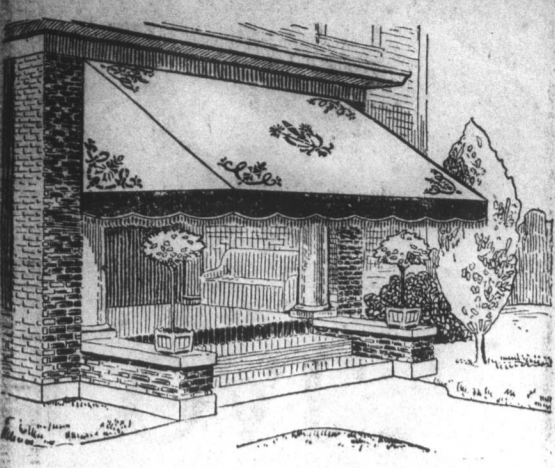
Sandfield, Mass., for the set.
