For the Voting Contest for the Sprint Race Classic at Charlotte August 23rd.

Charlotte, June 17.—Five young ladies who have just graduated from the Central High School at Charlotte have been nominated sponsors for the voting contest for the world's sprint race classic to be held at Charlotte August 23rd.

Each sponsor will nominate six maids to assist her in this contest. Miss Harris has already nominated the following maids: Edna Bisset, Mary G. Graham, Virginia Hart, Virginia Mobley, Sarah Wakefield and Dorothy Aiken.

Miss Maude Brown, of Concord, will be sponsor representing the Fred Y. McConnell American Legion Auxiliary.

Mrs. Mary Payne, of Gastonia, will be sponsor from the Woman's Club in Gastonia.

Miss Emily Gregg will be the sponsor for Lincolnton representing the American Legion of that town.

Miss Mary Cornelius will be the sponsor from Mooresville, representing the Wilder Gresham post No. 66 American Legion Auxiliary.

Mrs. Don Cochran, Jr., will be sponsor from Statesville representing Hurst Turner post No. 65 American Legion Auxiliary.

The list of sponsors is growing from day to day and will be announced from time to time.

A new feature of the world's sprint race classic which will take place at the Charlotte speedway August 23rd is the fact that all tickets will have attached to them a coupon allowing the purchaser to cast ten votes for each dollar represented in the ticket.

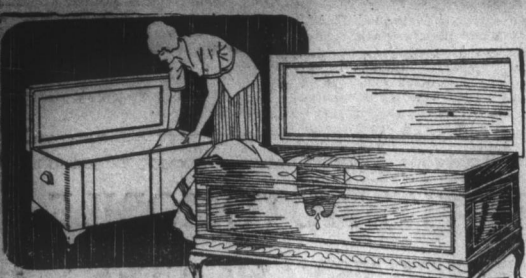
