NEW YORK PASSES FLOOD AID QUOTA

Class \$1,580,000 for Red Cross Relief of Mississippi Valley Sufferers. Washington, June 11.—New York City, one of the forty-six cities which have exceeded their quota of the American Red Cross fund for relief of Mississippi River flood sufferers. New York's quota was \$1,200,000 and the amount collected up to June 1 was \$1,580,000, as officially reported. A grand total of \$14,623,896.48 has been received from all sources, including monthly and foreign chapters of the Red Cross, according to the Manufacturers' Record. This includes the \$10,000 contribution from the regular funds of the Red Cross.

SATISFACTION WITH NEW LAWS, JOHNSON SAYS

Has Visited 20 Counties Where New Laws Are Now in Effect. The Tribune Bureau. Sir Walter Hotel. Raleigh, June 11.—General satisfaction with the new laws in the twenty-two counties visited by him were reported by Charles M. Johnson, Executive Secretary to the county Government advisory commission, at their meeting in Raleigh, Friday morning. Mr. Johnson pointed out in his report that the county officials while co-operating, were not breaking any records in introducing the various changes required by the new county acts. This is due chiefly to the poor condition in most counties of the records of past years' experience. Also, of course it takes time to understand the laws and get new forms ready.

MIDWIVES FINISH HEALTH UNIT HERE COURSE GIVEN BY

Nineteen Persons Have Finished the Course and Have Made Application for Re-Registration. Nineteen midwives practicing in Cabarrus county have completed the course of instruction given by the county health department, and have applied to the State for re-registration. The State law requires that midwives take this instruction each year and re-register. It is unlawful to practice in this county who has not complied with these regulations. The course is given by the county health officer and county nurse, and covers the essential things a midwife should know in order to safeguard the lives of the mothers and babies she attends. The attention of the public is called to the fact that the registration certificate is not a license to practice midwifery. The certificate only keeps a check on the person who practices and lets them know what the State requires of them.

STEADY INCREASE POSTAL RECEIPTS PAST FEW MONTHS

Increase of \$126,000 Is Noted in Receipts at Concord Postoffice During Months of March, April, May. Indicative of the steady growth of Concord and vicinity, the local postoffice receipts for the months of March, April and May show an increase of practically \$126,000 over the corresponding period of 1926, according to S. S. Neal, assistant postmaster. The greatest increase during the three-month period this year was registered in the month of April, when the receipts totaled \$3,492.96 in comparison with \$3,138.30 in April, 1926, or an increase of \$354.66.
