Wants Immediate Action On Aid To **European Nations**

Asks For Unity Of Country In Maintaining Peace; Gets Big Ovation

President Harry S. Truman in his message to the joint session of both houses of congress yesterday at noon, recommended a three point program for keeping world peace which included immediate passage of the aid to European nations bill, prompt enactment of universal military training legislation and the temctive service system.

Before asking Congress to act on this program, he reviewed world conditions and said, "We must act now for peace."

He told of Russia's use of the veto power in hampering the work of the United Nations and said she also destroyed the in-dependence of several European

He spoke of the meeting at this time in Europe of the free nations seeking to re-habilitate themselves. And in discussing Russia's attitude toward this he said that she did not want the United States to help these nations nor did she want these nations to help themselves.

The pattern is clear," he said. He also spoke of the fact that the free nations were drawing closer together. He pointed out that it had become necessary for the United States to take additional measures to support the (Continued on page 4)
