Hundreds of people are expectted to begin their Christmas buying here in earnest this week end when the holiday shopping season is officially opened with the appearance of Santa Claus, the turning on of the Christmas lights and the completion of the street decorations.

Santa will arrive in time for the parade at 11:00 o'clock and will spend the rest of the day in town, in the various stores and on the streets contacting as many children as possible. Everyone is invited to see Santa and to shop here.

Draftees May Be **Inducted Early**

Edward Osborne, chairman of the Ashe County Draft Board, announced this week that the local board now has authority to send men for induction ahead of the regular schedule. He stated that several registrants had asked to be inducted early.

"Registrants who make the request in writing to the draft board, will be allowed to go for the pre-induction examination in the next quota from the county,' Mr. Osborne said.

He pointed out that he did not want to leave the impression that the draft board wanted anyone to go ahead of schedule but that the board was only offering this service to those men who wish to go into the service earlier.
