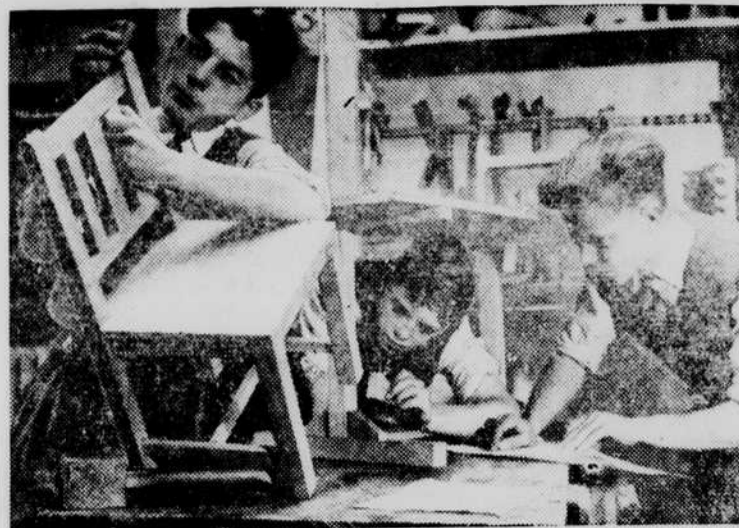


Warrensville News
