

Bob White Quail Protected By Planting Cover Seeds

Bobwhite quail in North Carolina will benefit by plantings of two and one-half tons of lespedeza seeds and more than a million rose plants throughout the State as a part of the Wildlife Resources Commission's game habitat restoration program, according to Clyde P. Patton, Executive Director of the Wildlife Resources Commission.

When planting operations are completed some time in April, a total of 340 acres of bicolor lespedeza and over 200 acres of sericea lespedeza will have been planted on farms in various parts of the State. The total acreage of lespedeza plantings is divided into individual cover strips 400

feet long and 15 feet wide. Multiflora rose, an oriental shrub, which has this year been introduced as a game cover plant in North Carolina, is being planted on a test basis. About 55,000 linear feet, or ten and one-half miles of multiflora seedlings are being planted on nine demonstration areas and on hundreds of individual farms. A single row of multiflora plants is sufficient to produce a living fence several feet wide and tall and dense enough to hold livestock within an enclosure of the plantings. At the same time multiflora produces ideal quail and rabbit cover.
