Alfalfa In This **Section Getting** New Leaf Spot

C. E. Gardner Reports That **Unfavorable Weather Cause** Spread Of Disease

A new leaf spot, pseudoplea medicagihis, is attacking alfalfa in this area at the present time and it is very important that this disease not be confused with one of the mineral element deficiencies, C. E. Gardner, assistant county agent, stated yesterday.


He pointed out that this fungus is spread by spores which attack the leaves and that the small brown spots can be seen on the leaves and as a result of these brown spots, the leaves turn yellow and fall off.

Mr. Gardner stated that if the alfalfa shows symptoms of this disease and if the leaves begin to fall off, farmers should mow their alfalfa or hay so as to save as many leaves as possible.

"Specialists at the North Caro ina State College stated that this disease is probably seed borne and that there is no control for it at the present time," the assistant agent said.

There is a possibility that unfavorable weather conditions may cause this fungus to spread more rapidly, he added.

By particularly early cutting. the disease may not be as severe Mr. Gardner said.




