Scottville H. D. Club Has Meeting

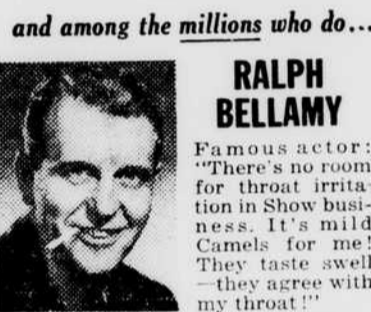
Mrs. Annie Osborne was hostess to the Scottville Home Demonstration club for their June meeting.
