Austrians Driven Back. London, Sept. 28.-6:20 p. m. -A Central News Dispatch from Rome says that the following telegram has been received there from Petrograd:

"The right wing of the Aus trians have been driven back be yond the Carpathians into Hungary, where they are being pursued by the Russians.

"The Austrians debacle is complete and they have lost all the artillery.

"The Austrians left wing has retreated to Cracow. The Russians have occupied another one of the forts of Przemysl."

English Naval Victory. London, Sept. 28.-5:17 p. m. -The official press bureau this afternoon issued the following statement:

"Operations of His Majesty's naval forces on the west coast of Africa have resulted in the unconditional surrender of Duala, the capital of Kamarum, and of Bonabori, to an Anglo-French force." Montenegrins Near Sarajevo. Cettinje, Sept. 28.-The Montenegrins are within artillery range of Sarajevo, capital of the Austrian province of Bosnia.

Przemysl Invested By Russians. Rome, Sept. 28.-An official dispatch from Petrograd says that Prezemsyl, in Galicia, is entirely invested by the Russians, and that the main Austrian is re-
