REV. BILLY SUNDAY IS TAKEN TO MAYO CLINIC.

Memphis, Tenn., May 13.—Rev. William A. (Bhly) Sunday, halted by illness in the midst of a revival campaign for the first time in his 32 years as an evangelist, rested at his hotel apartment here early tonight while preparations were completed for his removal to Rochester, Minn., for treatment at the clinic of Mayo brothers.

While no official announcement was made prior to his departure from his hotel as to the nature of his illness it is understood that he is suffering from an attack of uremic poisoning.

Mr. Sunday was taken ill Saturday and his condition became so serious as to bring about a decision to take him at once to the Rochester hospital.
