Raleigh, N. C., Oct. 11 .- Coopera-

tion in selling dairy products, when properly developed and managed will increase its returns, but efficient production of milk is the most important factor in successful dairying; "Efficient production is still within the cotrol of the individual dairy man," says John A Arey, dairy extension specialist at State College. "This factor is not dependent on group action. If all the dairymen of the State knew exactly what it wa scosting them to produce milk, the danger of over-production would be greatly reduced. There would be no surplus at any of our large milk markets if the unprofitable cows were slaughtered.'

Mr. Arey states that the benefits which are unprofitable cannot be over-estimated. He states that a striking example of this was seen 18 cows was returning a profit while the other 18 animals were not pay-
